## VALEDICTORIAN & SALUTATORIAN POLICY

- 1. The student must graduate with his/her class as a senior class member in good standing with all accounts paid.
- 2. The member of the graduating class with the highest weighted GPA who has been enrolled full-time for the 4 full semesters prior to graduation will be recognized as the valedictorian.
- 3. The member of the graduating class with the second-highest weighted GPA who has been enrolled full-time for the 4 full semesters prior to graduation will be recognized as the salutatorian.
- 4. Up to <u>12</u> AP and Dual Credit courses will be weighted and receive one extra GPA point (A-5, B-4, C-3, D-2).
  - a. A list of AP and weighted Dual Credit courses will be maintained on the school website. Other Dual Credit courses will not count toward a student's GPA.
  - b. Dual Credit courses on the list at the time coursework begins will be weighted.
  - c. Students must take and pass the AP Exam for each AP course for it to be weighted.
- 5. Students who have not attended SCS for all 8 semesters (grades 9-12) will be required to submit an official transcript from each accredited high school he or she has attended, and those grades will be used to calculate the student's GPA.
  - a. Weighting of grades from other schools will only be recognized if the weighted system is comparable with courses and weighting offered by SCS.
  - b. Grades from non-accredited schools (i.e. home school) will not be used to calculate the student's GPA.
- 6. In the event there is a tie for either Valedictorian or Salutatorian, the following tie-breaker will apply:
  - a. The student with the highest composite score on the ACT will receive the award.
  - b. If the ACT scores are the same, the students will be co-recipients of the award
- 7. This policy will take effect for the 2024 Graduation Program.
